

Bibboll St - window (parrot)


Chapel St - loose stone

Offer purse to brusher → you get a toffee



look up MacLane in index → "Men of Bibliothek" (+1)  
(Men of Bibliothek: 1240-1939; looking up by surname)  
too recent: Widdowson, Farlow, Burges, Basleyfield, Spencer  
too modest: MacLane  
cont find: Zinovie, hulky

look up hulky in index → "The Clavigula" (+1)

look up Arkwright in index → "The Reign of Akhenaten" (borrowed by master)

look up noble in index → "Complete Poems" of Simon Noble (1631-1676),  
but has been borrowed.

x Clavigula (by Raymond Lully (1235-1315)), alchemist  
↳ "little key"

look up page 364 in Clavigula - Recipe for Elixing of life

start ē quantity of the "Spittle of June"

- Pray to God for guidance in the Work

- Heat Spittle in glass retort continuously.

1) sweeten it ē Sap of the Wood of Hermes (also Honey of the Egyptians)

2) bitter it ē Bath of the King

3) salt it ē Water of Sages

look up Nobel in madame

- (1631-1676), minor metaphysical poet

- friend to Andrew Marvell (not in Madame)

look up Arkwright in madame

Prof.-Sir Joseph Arkwright, O.M. (b. 1782)

- authority of Egypt's 14th Dynasty, 1931-33 expedition

- taught arch at X-Munster until 1937

ask master for Arkwright [+]

"The Amarna period... see Wilderstein"

X Arkwright

Pharaoh Akhenaten (ruled Egypt 1358-1340 BC)

attempted to replace Amon-Ra's priesthood & religion of Aten (sun-disk)

look up page 143 in Arkwright

Akh. discontinued the Osiris ritual, in which Osiris/Sethos was purified, anointed, & offered incense by the king.

knock on B2. Show Arkwright to Wilderstein (can enter B2)

Prof W's Study (window to N, desk, fireplace to W, exit E, Prof)

ask prof abt Osiris

- Arkw. interpreted paintings at Karnak & Abydos.

- Egyptians worshiped tamarisk tree (wood of Hermes)

ask prof abt griffins



- x first bin > "William Casynges"
- 2nd bin > "Thomas Heydon"
- 3rd bin > "Elias Tymme"
- 4th bin > "Edward Farber" (red)
- 5th bin > "Bernard Sturkey"
- 6th bin > "Robert Mayor"
- 7th bin > "Francis Tawsend"

Wm Casynges (1435-1481) was cellarier from 1472 (stated plays of cellarers)

Heydon (d. 1512) cellarier + bursar from 1502 (joint office for 3 centuries)

Tymme (1598-1676) bursar from 1640 (garden)

Farber (1646-1698) bursar from 1682

- hired Sir Wm Hawksmoor to rebuild chapel, incl minaret in tower.

Sturkey (1687-1757) bursar from 1737-1752 (master from 1752-1757)

Mayor (1715-1770) bursar from 1752 (gardens)

Tawsend (1722-1781) bursar from 1770-1782.

Tymme was Vaughn's cellarier.

- search third bin → bottle (green) -

- 2nd course (fork, knife, glass (wine), plate (snail))


snail in dead & grips plate - turn snail in fork & knife - cut snail with knife
